The Council of Kadosh

The word "Kadosh" usually translates from Hebrew to "holy" in English. A more precise translation is "separated". The mission of masonry is not to create "holy" men, but to set apart from the rest of humanity those exemplary men who practice the more noble virtues in the pursuit of truth.

The degrees encompassed by the Council of Kadosh are the 19th through the 30th degrees. Although Albert Pike identifies them as chivalric or philosophical, they are all intensely mystical with respect to the lessons covered and symbols employed. The complexity of these degrees cannot be overstated and is exemplified by the number of pages attributed to them in Morals and Dogma. The 28th degree alone is more than one quarter of the 1,000+ pages.

The degrees within the Council are designed to explore further the moral, political and religious lessons taught in the Lodge of Perfection and the Chapter of Rose Croix. The Council degrees explain why morality in the practice of virtue is indispensable to Masons. The political lessons within the Council explain why intolerance, superstition and bigotry are special enemies of human freedom.

The degrees of the Rite do not tell a person what he should think about these questions. Instead, they tell him what the great thinkers and civilizations of the past have thought and they try creating a situation in which the candidate or Brother can gain insight. Agreeing with what Socrates said that the unexamined life is not worth living, the Rite helps with this self-examination by providing reference points.

Remember that these lessons are provided for education, not for doctrine. The manner in which you worship the creator is a private concern and Freemasonry will not interfere with that. Our symbols

are to bring in interpretation within the confines of your own beliefs, without intrusion.

On February 5, 2013 Robert J. Selden, 33° was installed as Venerable Master of Kadosh of the Minneapolis Consistory.

The new Master of Kadosh was raised as a Master Mason at Richfield Lodge No. 334 on May 5, 1993. The very next year he was appointed Senior Deacon and progressed through the line, becoming Master in 1997. The following year he was elected as Secretary of the lodge and served in that position for 3 years. He was honored with the Hiram Award by Cataract Lodge in 2001 for his service and dedication to the Lodge. He is also a member of St John's Lodge No. 1 where he has served as Chaplain for the last 5 years.

Bob is a Past Commander of Zuhrah Shriner's Legion of Honor (2007) and was the LOH Degree Team President for 2010-2011. He is also a member of the Ceremonial Unit serving on the Sound Committee. Bob is currently Sovereign Master of Johnny Nelson Council, Allied Masonic Degrees.

He became a member of the Minneapolis Valley, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry in the 1993 Fall Class and became actively involved on the Sound Committee. He performed in the 15th Degree for many years and is now in the 4th Degree as Junior Warden along with his duties as Director of the 32nd and as Master of Kadosh.

Bob received the Rank and Decoration of Knight Commander Court of Honour in October, 2001, at the 200th Anniversary session in Charleston, N.C and was Coroneted a 33° Inspector General Honorary in 2007 in Washington D.C. at the first joint Northern and Southern Jurisdiction Session.

He was born in Preston, Minnesota and soon moved to Bloomington where he graduated from Abraham Lincoln Sr. High. Bob later joined the U.S. Air Force where he served 20 years working in both Aircraft Maintenance and Communications Electronics. Through his Air Force career he provided communications support for 3 Presidential campaigns and various other international events.
