Library Committee

The Minneapolis Valley Scottish Rite library committee is made up of 15 dedicated brothers who are committed to organizing the books, lectures and artifacts in a digitized form for their preservation. It is being done not only to preserve but also to make available the contents of our library for the benefit of all Masons in Minnesota.

The library is the largest repository of all forms of Masonic literature in the state of Minnesota. A majority of our collection was acquired during Brother Lee's tenure as librarian between 1919 and 1920. It was the aim to make the library a premier resource for Masonic research. It was the wish of our past librarian Brother O. Medford Kelly that the resources be put in a form that could be shared, via an open link accessible 24/7 to all Scottish Rite Valleys, Lodges of Perfection and other appendant bodies throughout the state. To date fewer than 300 books have been digitized with more than 7000 to go.

To continue this great work we are in need of computers and software as well as the donation of time and effort from our brothers in the Minneapolis Valley Scottish Rite. If you wish to become involved by

helping with a donation or just your time stop by the library and let us know.

A Quick Note

From The Supreme Council – and the Secretary

The Valley received word from the Supreme Council that for 2014 they will be issuing permanent dues cards. It will be a plastic card similar to a credit card and there will not be a date on the card. There will be a sticker issued each year indicating the date of your current dues, after you pay your dues. (Like AAA does) This move to a permanent dues card will save the Supreme Council a ton of money each year issuing dues cards. It will also make our job in the Valley administerting dues much easier as well. So, as we get into the 2014 dues year be on the lookout for your new "PERMANENT" dues card. Also, 2014 is the last of the \$2 per year per-capita increases by the Supreme Council. With this last increase our dues will finally level out at \$90. At this time you should all have a 2013 membership card in your pocket.

Scottish Rite Lighting Committee "Providing further light in Masonry since the invention of candles."

Okay, that may be going a bit too far. But we can say the lighting committee has been around a long time working with costuming, makeup, properties, directors, and actors of the Minneapolis Valley from the beginning and later with the sound crew.

The lighting committee has the fun of lighting the action of the degrees, creating a mood for scenes, spotlighting orators and key players, and providing special effects such as talking skeletons and "dead guys" (sages). To accomplish these feats of daring, we run a programmable lighting control board, man spotlights, play slight-of-hand with slides in the stereopticon, and provide the "gong" work in the 31th degree.

A newer lighting board allows programming of lighting cues for most of the degrees even though we manually control the first eight degrees as a refresher course at the beginning of each degree cycle. We follow the lighting cues on cue cards and scripts. We continue to add scripts as changes are made by directors. We will be updating our programming and cue cards over the next year to tighten up the timing and lighting effects for the action. A mixture of equipment from the 1930's to the new control board keeps us on our toes as we

look to continually improve matching the lighting effects with the action on the floor.

The lighting committee is looking for new members to join us to continue the excellence in this important area of production. If you have technical or programming experience, which would be a plus but is certainly not needed to learn and enjoy lighting the degree work. How many of you have watched the degree work from the balcony? We think they're the best seats in the house! Many times we are able to eat together at the earlier workers dinner then spend time visiting with a lot of good discussions and laughter.
