Tyranny

Lessons in Masonry teach us we should resist tyranny. I believe that it is our duty to not submit to tyrannical leaders, however many obligations and oaths tell us to submit to the legal authorities of the country where we reside.

This can be conflicting. What if the country's leaders are in fact tyrants? Do we submit to the legal authority of the country or do we resist? What does resistance mean?

First, in the United States of America we have the right to vote. If you notice that a politician is acting in a manner that you can reasonably believe will lead to tyranny, then vote for the other guy. When leaders act in a tyrannical manner, then resist in a legal manner.

We all have the ability to resist tyranny in a legal manner by supporting groups or organizations that challenge leaders through the judicial system. Remember in the United States we have three branches of government; the Legislative, Executive, and Judiciary which are all separate. I don't agree with some of the people who have said the three separate branches are equal, rather from my observations the power seems to ebb and flow over time.

The three branches create a condition where action can also be advocated through the legislative branch. The legislators are close to their constituency. This allows for access by the people. Legislators learn they must acknowledge

the concerns of the voters who elect them or soon they will be out of a job. I acknowledge that if an individual holds an opinion that is different from the main stream of their community it is unlikely to sway the legislator to change course, but it is possible through persistence and advocating others in the community to express the same position that change can come about. Patience is the key with this method.

Another method of resisting tyranny in the United States is to use public relations to sway leaders that are not acting in the best interests of the citizens. Many times, to gain the most effect, use of this tool is necessary to join a group whose goals mirror your goal of resisting tyranny. Leaders are generally political animals and the great tide of public opinion can be enough to gain correct behavior.

We are lucky to live in the United States of America where these tools can be used. In many countries, over many ages, the tyrant uses so much corrosive power that citizens could effectively not resist their power or authority. History will tell us that at some point the citizens will no longer tolerate the tyrannical behavior of such leaders and the people as a whole will rise up and throw the devils out.

Our duty as Masons in this country is to be alert for tyrannical behavior and use softer means of correction; interaction with legislators, the pressure of public opinion, the ballot box, and the power of judicial decisions. These are all great tools at our disposal.
