In many years past, when the spring cycle of degrees was completed, we used to have what was called the workers dinner. This dinner was a free dinner to all of the Brothers who had so diligently worked to put on two cycles of degrees. This included all of the committees in the Minneapolis Valley – sound, lighting, properties, choir, dining room, greeters, wardrobe, make-up, kitchen, office staff, and any other committees that I have not mentioned.

Fifteen years ago, the Consistory came up with the idea of creating an evening that would be similar to going to an Academy Award Ceremony. This included a very nice meal down in the dining room, followed by an Award Ceremony held in the Auditorium. This Consistory Feast has been a tradition since its inception and we hope will continue long into the future. This award program is no small undertaking, and we have to use almost all of the committees in order to make the evening happen.

We have Job's Daughters from one or two of our Bethels, dressed in beautiful gowns to escort the winners to the East to receive their awards, and then back to their seats. While they are being escorted, we have an amazing piano player who plays great impromptu piano music to keep the ceremony alive and fun. The Consistory Officers are all dressed in tuxedos and the Auditorium is always decked out to look like the stage of an Academy Award Ceremony. You really can't get a more grand room than our auditorium to hold an event like that.

Oscar Award-looking trophies are ordered for individual recipients, or groups of recipients. Many of the awards are given to individual actors in the degrees because of their excellence in one of the following categories: Best Actor in a Leading Role; Best Supporting Actor in a Major Role; Best Supporting Actor in a Minor Role; Best New (Neophyte) Actor; Best Actor in a New Role; Best Orator; Best Director; and several others.

Some of the awards are given to individuals who have non-acting roles but may be on a committee or doing something related to the degree work, or in supporting each Thursday evening as a whole. These awards would include: Wardrobe; Dining Room; Properties; Sound; Lighting; Greeters; Office Staff; KSA; and several others.

Some of the awards are given to groups of people who have worked together on a degree or on a committee. These awards would include: Best Team Award, which is given to several actors who played off of each other to make their degree really fly; The Lodge of the Year Award which awards the Lodge which brings in the highest number of new members each year, and is presented on a plaque which is presented to the Master of that Lodge — a second identical plaque is hung in the lobby of the Scottish Rite; and The Best Degree Award which is given to the entire Degree team who put on the most memorable degree of the entire year. This award is put on a Loving Cup and is kept at the Scottish Rite for all to see and enjoy during the year.

Refreshments are served after the award ceremony for social time and congratulations!

This event is a great event which is the culmination of each Scottish Rite Year. If you haven't been to one of these Consistory Feasts and award ceremonies, you really should consider coming. It is an event which you will enjoy and remember.
